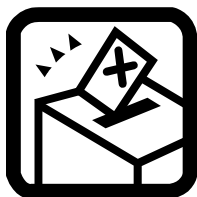

Are you looking for a way to get more involved in your community? Run for a Director position with the Green Trails Improvement Association (GTIA). GTIA is your homeowners association. The GTIA board consists of 15 directors – one per area – who are tasked with the job of keeping Green Trails’ common areas beautiful. Becoming a board member offers a unique volunteer opportunity to make a visible difference in your community.

This year, 8 of the 15 Board of Directors positions are up for election. At the beginning of October, an election ballot is sent to every homeowner in the areas up for election. If you don’t know the area in which you reside, check the mailing label on the back of this newsletter. Areas are referenced by the letters A through O.

### **What does GTIA do?**

GTIA's main responsibility is to maintain 16 of the 26 miles of paths that wind their way through the Green Trails subdivision. The other 10 miles are maintained primarily by the Lisle Park District. GTIA also maintains 198 lights along those 16 miles of trails and maintains the areas around the 5 Green Trails welcome signs. GTIA operated on an approximate budget of \$400,000 for 2008.

### **What do board members do?**

Board members meet in the evenings on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of each month. Meetings typically are held at Kennedy Junior High, but the location may vary and any changes in location are printed in the Pathfinder newsletter and on the home page of the website ([www.greentrails.org](http://www.greentrails.org)) before the meeting. The meetings can last anywhere from 30 minutes to 2 hours. Board members also serve on committees where their talents can best be put to use. Committees may meet a few times per year.

### **Why are there so many openings for board members?**

Typically, 5 board positions (one-third) are up for election each year. However, due to a lack of candidates in previous elections, some board members have been appointed to their positions. Appointed board members live in Green Trails, but do not necessarily live in the area that they represent. These positions, therefore, are put up for election. If you live in an area whose position is not up for election and you want to be considered for an appointed position, please contact management.

## Summary of GTIA Board Meeting Minutes July 8, 2008 Pending Board Approval

President, Peter Bakas called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM in the Board conference room at the Lisle Village Hall. Board members present: Peter Bakas, John Charicki, Pat Coughlin-Schillo, Craig Donofrio, Rodd Elges, Rob Getz, Linda Gilbert, Gerry Jackson, Les Lavin, Betty Long, Gail Robinson. Board members excused: Joan Dudas, Marg Hough, Terri Kolman, Julie LaFond. Management: Joanne Broda. Paula Gleason was Recording Secretary. A quorum was present.

### Open Forum: None

**Minutes of the Prior Meeting:** Minutes of the prior meeting were reviewed; however, it was noted that Roberts' Rules only permitted for certain Board motions to be approved by proxy. The proxy votes that were valid had been submitted by Board member Les Lavin. It was also requested that lot numbers be included in the description of a problem area referenced under Open Forum.

**Board Motion:** Gerry Jackson moved to approve amendment to, and Board motions of, the June meeting, Betty Long seconded. The motion was passed by a unanimous voice vote.

**Treasurer's Report:** John Charicki reviewed the June Balance Sheet and Income and Expense Statement. John noted that the operating fund CD in the amount of \$153,615.51 will mature on 7/11/08 and one of the replacement fund CD's will mature on 7/13/08 in the amount of \$117,708.57. The consensus of the Board was to deposit these funds into the Wall Street checking account until interest rates improve.

**Board Motion:** Rodd Elges motioned to accept the revised check register expenditures of \$28,307.94 for July, Gerry Jackson seconded. Motion was passed by a unanimous voice vote.

**Management Report:** Telephone log line items were reviewed.

Management stated that work on the concrete trail section should begin the week of 7/7. Sealcoat and crackfill work is underway. Weather has been a problem due to so much rain.

Greg Moore will begin work to improve a current retaining wall no later than mid-July.

After reviewing the proposal from Piper's, which was received after the June meeting, the Board consensus was to approve the Gregg Moore proposal of \$960

#### GTIA Yearly Assessment Policy

Assessments are paid annually. The billing for the new year's assessment will be mailed out no later than Nov. 29th. Payment is due Jan. 1st. If payment is not received by Feb. 1st, an administrative fee is added to the assessment. If an owner does not receive an invoice by Dec. 10th, notify management immediately. GTIA policy states the homeowner is responsible for paying on time, with or without the invoice. If your address has changed, or if you have any questions regarding your bill, call Joanne Broda at JRM Properties at 630-961-7456.

#### SELLING? REFINANCING?

Anyone selling or refinancing within the Green Trails Improvement Association area should require a letter from JRM Properties, Inc., regarding their status of the yearly assessment charge. compared to Piper's bid in the amount of \$1,700, to put down mulch around the small pines along College Road. This work is to be done no later than the week of 7/14.

Management distributed copies of the revised Delinquent Account Collection Policy to be placed in directors' binders.

It was noted that the meeting location for the August meeting will also be in the board room at the Lisle Village Hall.

Management suggested the Board may want to consider a subsidy for the lawn maintenance contractor due to the current high cost of gasoline.

**Board Motion:** Gerry Jackson motioned to request Management issue a check to the lawn maintenance contractor in the amount of \$2,000.00 to cover additional fuel costs, Betty Long seconded. The motion was passed by a unanimous voice vote.

Management noted there were no new sales in June in the College Green apartment-condo conversion.

Management reported that there were no new sales in June in the Torrey Pines conversion.

Management provided a list of June 2008 newcomers. Board Directors are encouraged to call on newcomers in their respective areas.

These volunteers accomplished a lot of hard work in two hours...thank you!

Les also shared copies of the L&N proposal in the amount of \$18,032 to repair ten critical areas of trail, which is already a budgeted expense.

**Parks Committee:** Pat Coughlin-Schillo shared a synopsis of the June Lisle Park District Board meeting. Betty Long will attend the Lisle Park District Board meeting in July and Linda Gilbert will attend in August. Pat discussed the Park Evaluation Forms that need to be executed by Board members. Pat then distributed a list of parks and requested Board members volunteer to sign up for the appropriate park or parks in their area. Evaluation forms will be sent out by email to each Director and each completed form is due by next Board meeting.

## **Safety when Filling Portable Fuel Containers**

With summer under way, here's an important question to consider: Have you been filling your portable fuel containers properly, applying all the necessary safety precautions? It's a task that must always be done with safety in mind, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), the American Petroleum Institute and other safety and fuel experts.

"Gasoline vapors (fumes) are extremely flammable and volatile. Static electricity can create a spark which in turn can cause a fire if it's near gasoline fumes," said Lt. Jay Caron of the Lisle-Woodridge Fire District.

The season brings many situations that may call for transporting gasoline or other liquid fuel in portable fuel containers, including for cars, lawnmowers, generators, boats, jet-skis and other vehicles and equipment. "Grounding is essential to avoid any build-up of static electricity that could result in disaster," said Lt. Caron. "Make sure the fuel container is grounded and stays grounded."

Basic safety steps for filling a portable fuel container, according to the NHTSA, include:

- ✓ Place the fuel container (use only an approved container) on the ground, outside the vehicle, to help ground the container.
- ✓ Keep the pump nozzle in contact with the container when filling, until filling is complete. That helps maintain grounding. Slightly tilt the nozzle so it touches the rim of the container, rather than placing it dead center.
- ✓ Don't use an automatic pump handle device – fill the container manually and slowly. That helps decrease the chance of static electricity build-up as well as spilling or splattering.
- ✓ Just as when pumping gasoline into a vehicle, smoking is strictly prohibited when filling a portable fuel container.

Grounding, simply put, provides a path for an electric current to discharge safely - the electricity is dissipated into the ground, when a portable fuel container is grounded.

"Every time you pump gasoline, a charge of electricity builds up on gasoline as it flows through a pipe or hose and this charge takes several seconds to several minutes to dissipate after the gasoline has reached the tank or container," explains Bob Renkes, executive director of the Petroleum Equipment Institute.

"That risk is avoided when you pump gasoline into your car, because both the gasoline dispenser and the vehicle are grounded. But a portable fuel container may not be grounded. For safety, you need to place the container on the ground and fill it on the ground," he said. Additionally, static electricity could build up when gasoline is flowing into the container. That's why it's important to keep the pump nozzle in contact with the fuel container. That contact sets up a connection between the pump, which is grounded, and the container, to help make sure the container stays grounded.

**Frozen Strawberry Margarita Pie (8 servings)**

This mildly spiked dessert is so easy to put together,  
...it will quickly become one of your summer-entertaining standbys.

**For Crust:**

- 1-1/4 C graham cracker crumbs                      5 Tbsp unsalted butter, melted
- 2 Tbsp sugar

**For Filling:**

- 1 lb strawberries, halved (3-1/2 C)              2 Tbsp Tequila
- 1 Tbsp finely grated lime zest (3 limes)      2 Tbsp Triple Sec or Cointreau
- 1/4 cup fresh lime juice (2 limes)              1-1/2 C chilled heavy cream
- 1 14 oz can sweetened condensed milk      Strawberries & whipped cream garnish

Preheat oven to 350 degrees with rack in middle position.

Stir together graham cracker crumbs, sugar and butter with a fork until combined well; then press evenly onto bottom and side of a buttered 9" metal or glass pie plate. Bake for 10 minutes, cool on a rack about 30 minutes.

**FILLING:**

Puree strawberries, zest, lime juice, condensed milk, tequila and liqueur in a blender until just smooth, then transfer to a large bowl. Beat cream in another bowl with an electric mixer at medium speed until it just holds stiff peaks. Fold one-third of cream into strawberry mixture gently but thoroughly to lighten, then fold in remainder in two batches. Pour filling into crust, mounding it slightly and freeze uncovered until firm, about 4 hours. Remove from freezer and let soften in refrigerator about 40 minutes before serving. Like gilding a lily, before serving, garnish with strawberries and whipped cream!
