

A Local Service You Should Know About

Roger and Barbara Schmith are the administrators of the Woodridge Community Pantry. Founded in 1992, the pantry was originally in service to the Village of Woodridge. In July 2007, a board decision was made to expand the service area to include Lisle, Darien, Downers Grove, Westmont, and Bolingbrook. Those communities were chosen because they are adjacent to the pantry's original service area, and because some of them did not have full time pantries of their own, only emergency supplies housed in churches.

It is the pantry's mission to not only eradicate hunger, but to improve the quality of life for local residents. Toward that end, various programs sponsored by the WCP include: ESL (English as a Second Language) classes; A Job For Me, which seeks to provide participants with skills necessary to obtain and maintain a job; and basic budgeting and financial management through All My Money.

Woodridge Community Pantry is sponsoring a free health fair on Saturday, May 3rd from 1:00 - 3:00 with dental, vision, blood sugar, blood pressure, and chiropractic screening, as well as much information on nutrition and wellness. The

health fair will also be a springboard for "A Taste of the Pantry", which will help clients learn how to create tasty and healthy meals from government commodities and other pantry food. Registration will also be taken for a class in nutrition offered at the pantry in conjunction with the University of Illinois Extension Service.

The pantry has two part-time employees, one to coordinate the warehouse and the other to coordinate volunteers. Over 100 volunteers donated 11,530 hours in 2007. Additional volunteers are always needed to better serve those who come to the pantry for assistance.

Open Forum: None

Minutes of the Prior Meeting: Minutes of the prior meeting were reviewed.

Board Motion: Betty Long moved to approve the minutes of the March meeting, Gerry Jackson seconded. The motion was passed by unanimous voice vote.

Treasurer's Report: John Charicki reviewed the March Balance Sheet and Income and Expense Statement.

Board Motion: Joan Dudas motioned to accept the revised check register expenditures of \$29,679.85 for April, Rodd Elges seconded. Motion was passed by unanimous voice vote.

Management Report: Telephone log line items were reviewed.

Management noted there were two new sales in March in the College Green apartment-condo conversion.

Management reported that there were no new sales in March in the Torrey Pines conversion.

Management will file liens against 33 unpaid assessment accounts unless partial or full payment is received prior to filing.

Gerry Jackson volunteered to pick up the 60 pine seedlings ordered from Kane-DuPage Soil & Water Conservation District on April 23rd.

Carol Carls has volunteered to paint the GTIA rain barrel, for the Lisle art project.

Spring-Green will be spraying the College Road pines during the week of April 14th.

Management obtained a quote in the amount of \$1,400 from Dick Malacek to repaint/stain the five entrance signs which is the same amount charged in 2004. The consensus of the Board was to proceed with this project; however, the Board requested Management and the Maintenance Committee to research if this work is necessary every two years.

Management noted that trail work this year will be minimal, consisting mostly of repairs. L&N is preparing

GTIA Yearly Assessment Policy

Assessments are paid annually. The billing for the new year's assessment will be mailed out no later than Nov. 29th. Payment is due Jan. 1 st. If payment is not received by Feb. 1 st, an administrative fee is added to the assessment. If an owner does not receive an invoice by Dec. 10th, notify management immediately. GTIA policy states the homeowner is responsible for paying on time, with or without the invoice. SELLING? REFINANCING?

pricing on this work. Management will inspect and evaluate the trails to determine any hard-to-access areas that may require concrete replacement. An evaluation report will be completed by the end of May.

Management submitted two quotes to power wash and restain the Gazebo with two colors. Clear Vision Cleaning provided a quote of \$2,250; Bob Jung Painting & Decorating provided a quote of \$3,180. The Board selected the Clear Vision proposal subject to a request for additional sanding of some spots (for which the Board permitted an allowance of a couple hundred dollars from the stated bid).

Management provided a list of March 2008 newcomers. Board Directors are encouraged to call on newcomers in their respective areas.

Finance Committee: John Charicki distributed copies of the 2007 Audit Report as prepared by DeRaimo, Hillger & Ripp. There were explanations and discussion regarding the replacement fund.

Board Motion: Betty Long moved to accept the 2007 Audit Report as submitted from

DeRaimo, Hillger & Ripp, Julie LaFond seconded. The motion was passed by unanimous voice vote.

John Charicki also submitted copies of an updated GTIA delinquent account collection policy as proposed by the committee. Several suggestions were offered to condense the policy and eliminate editorial comment. The committee will meet this month to review all suggestions and finalize revisions to the policy for the next Board meeting.

Maintenance Committee: Les Lavin requested volunteers to plant the 60 new pine seedlings. Volunteers will meet at Kona's Coffee Shop on Saturday, April 26th, at 9:00 am.

Les has noticed that 3 to 4 large Scotch pines along College Road need to be removed, 2 or 3 small White pines are dead but the Winters Nursery Spruce replacements are doing well. At present, there are approximately 30 trees over 3 feet tall in the nursery that can be transplanted this year. Maintenance Committee will review the list of where to transplant later in the year.

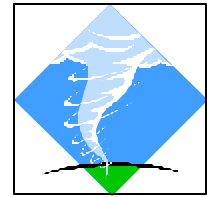

Tornado Safety *Lisle-Woodridge Fire Prevention Bureau*



The Lisle-Woodridge Fire District wants to remind its residents that we are currently in the season of severe weather. This is the time of the year when tornadoes are common and when one approaches, immediate action can save you life.

There are terms to remember about tornadoes:

A TORNADO WATCH means that weather conditions are right for the formation of tornadoes. You should listen to local radio and television stations for weather up-dates. The Weather Channel on cable television will keep you posted to local weather developments. During this time, a battery operated radio or television should be kept nearby to listen to weather advisories even if the sky is blue and does not look ominous.

A TORNADO WARNING means that a tornado has been spotted. You should pay attention to where it was seen, its direction of travel, and the length of time for which the warning has been issued. Within the boundaries of the Lisle-Woodridge Fire District there are outdoor warning sirens that will sound for 3 minutes at a steady tone if the path of the tornado covers the area. Again, the local radio stations will provide warning information. If a TORNADO WARNING has been issued, seek shelter. If possible, take a flashlight and a battery operated radio or television with you to listen for updates on the storm's activities. If, during a TORNADO WARNING or during a SEVERE THUNDERSTORM, you hear the outdoor warning sirens, TAKE COVER AT ONCE. DO NOT CALL THE FIRE DISTRICT OR POLICE DEPARTMENT to inquire what they mean. These emergency services will be busy with emergency calls and your non-emergency call will tie up telephone lines.

Prepare in advance and follow your plan –

In Homes – The basement offers the greatest safety. Seek shelter under sturdy furniture, if possible. In homes without basements, take cover in the center part of the house on the lowest floor in a small room such as a closet or bathroom or under sturdy furniture. ALWAYS stay away from outside walls and windows. If the windows are open, leave them alone. The National Weather Service has changed its directive regarding open windows. They now report the public should not waste time trying to open windows as it does NOT prevent building damage. Instead, take cover immediately, if you are in the path of a tornado.

In Office Buildings – Go to the designated shelter area of the building. If there is no designated shelter, go to an interior hallway on the lowest floor. Lie low with hands covering the back of your head to reduce neck injury.

In Schools – Follow advance plans to the designated shelter area. Stay out of auditoriums, gymnasiums and other areas with wide, free-span roofs. Lie low with hands covering the back of your head.

In Shopping Centers – Follow advance plans to the designated shelter area. If there isn't one, go to the center of the building on the lowest level. Stay away from large open rooms and windows. Lie low with hands covering the back of your head.

In Open Country – Move away from the tornado's path at right angles. If there is not time to escape, lie flat in the nearest ditch or ravine and cover the back of your head and neck. Stay out from under large trees, branches and high power electric lines. Keep alert for flash floods that often accompany such storms.

In Mobile Homes – These are particularly vulnerable to over turning during strong winds and should be evacuated when strong winds are forecast. Securing trailers with cable anchored in concrete footings can minimize damage. Trailer parks should have community storm shelters and a warden to monitor broadcasts throughout the severe storm emergency. If there is no shelter nearby, leave the trailer park and take cover on low, protected ground.

Camping – Follow the rules listed above for "Open Country" and "Mobile Homes". Many campgrounds have designated shelter areas. You should make yourself aware of their locations PRIOR to severe storms.



Outdoor warning sirens are tested the first Tuesday of each month at 10 AM in Lisle, Naperville and Woodridge and at 10:30 AM in Glen Ellyn.
