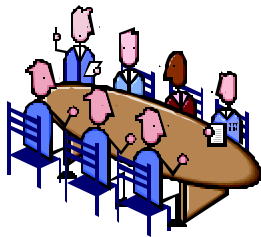




Get Involved in Your Green Trails!



Are you looking for a way to get more involved in your community? Run for a Director position with the Green Trails Improvement Association (GTIA). GTIA is your homeowners association. The GTIA board consists of 15 directors – one per area – who are tasked with the job of keeping Green Trails’ common areas beautiful. Becoming a board member offers a unique volunteer opportunity to make a visible difference in your community.

This year, 7 of the 15 Board of Directors positions are up for election. At the beginning of October, an election ballot is sent to every homeowner in the areas up for election. Summary of GTIA Board Meeting Tuesday July 10, 2007

President, Peter Bakas called the meeting to order at 7:35 PM at Village of Lisle Police Department Training Room. Board members present: Peter Bakas, John Charicki, Pat Coughlin-Schillo, Joan Dudas, Rodd Elges, Linda Gilbert, Les Lavin, Betty Long, Gail Robinson. Board members excused: Rob Getz, Marg Hough, Gerry Jackson, Terri Kolman, Tom Maslanka. Board Member Absent: Julie LaFond. Management: Joe and Joanne Broda. Paula Gleason was Recording Secretary. A quorum was present.

Open Forum: None

Minutes of the Prior Meetings: Minutes of the prior meeting were reviewed. Corrections were requested for the second paragraph, first sentence under Management Report, that the word "repair" should be "replacement" and the word "partially" should be removed.

Board Motion: Rodd Elges moved to approve the minutes of the June meeting as amended, Gail Robinson seconded. The motion was passed by unanimous voice vote.

Treasurer's Report: John Charicki reviewed the June Balance Sheet and Income and Expense Statement. It was noted a CD in the operating account would be coming due on 7/11 and will go directly into the checking account. Also, a CD would be coming due on 7/13; the consensus of the Board was to reinvest this CD for 12 months with Lisle Bank @5.25%.

Board Motion: Joan Dudas motioned to accept the revised check register expenditures of \$63,116.15 for July, Pat Coughlin-Schillo seconded. Motion was passed by unanimous voice vote.

Management Report: Telephone log line items were reviewed.

Management noted that there have been a total of 35 College Green apartment-condo conversions, with 61 left to be converted.

Management reported that there have been 6 Torrey Pines conversions; with 24 units in the building, 18 remain to be converted.

Management provided a list of June 2007 newcomers. Board Directors are encouraged to call on newcomers in their respective areas.

Finance Committee: The Finance Committee and Maintenance Committee will meet jointly on July 12th to schedule projects and discuss next year's budget.

Maintenance Committee: Les Lavin reported that in the process of rebuilding lattice work for the back of the

GTIA Yearly Assessment Policy

Assessments are paid annually. The billing for the new year's assessment will be mailed out no later than Nov. 29th. Payment is due Jan. 1 st. If payment is not received by Feb. 1 st, an administrative fee is added to the assessment. If an owner does not receive an invoice by Dec. 10th, notify management immediately. GTIA policy states the homeowner is responsible for paying on time, with or without the invoice. If your address has changed, or if you have any questions regarding your bill, call Joanne Broda at JRM Properties at 961-7456.

SELLING? REFINANCING?

Anyone selling or refinancing within the Green Trails Improvement Association area should require a letter from JRM Properties, Inc., regarding their status of the yearly assessment charge. Requests for such may be called into the Management Office or requested by letter. Information to provide is as follows: 1) Property address; 2) Seller's attorney name and phone number; 3) Buyer's name; and 4) Date of closing. What does GTIA do?

GTIA's main responsibility is to maintain 16 of the 26 miles of paths that wind their way through the Green Trails subdivision. The other 10 miles are maintained primarily by the Lisle Park District. GTIA also maintains 198 lights along those 16 miles of trails and maintains the areas around the 5 Green Trails welcome signs. GTIA operated on an approximate budget of \$400,000 for 2006.

What do board members do?

Board members meet in the evenings on the 2^d Tuesday of each month. Meetings typically are held at Kennedy Junior High, but the location may vary and any changes in location are printed in the Pathfinder newsletter before the meeting. The meetings can last

anywhere from 30 minutes to 2 hours. Board members also serve on committees where their talents can best be put to use. Committees may meet a few times per year.

Why are there so many openings for board members?

Typically, 5 board positions (one-third) are up for election each year. However, due to a lack of candidates in previous elections, some board members have been appointed to their positions. Appointed board members live in Green Trails, but do not necessarily live in the area that they represent. These positions, therefore, are put up for election. If you live in an area whose position is not up for election and you want to be considered for an appointed position, please contact management.

If you would like to know more about what is involved in being a board member or need more information on becoming a candidate, please call management at 961-7456 or contact the current board member for your area. Gazebo, he has encountered large amounts of gnarly roots that are wound around the lattice currently in place. The consensus of the Board was to ask Management to request a proposal from Greg Moore to clean out this area.

Discussion ensued about how mowing is being accomplished around some of the newer tree plantings. It was agreed Management will spray Round-up that will leave a ring around the trees and allow tall grass to grow near the roots; the landscaping contractor will be advised to stay away from the rings when mowing.

It was noted that thistles are growing prominently in a particular area of the Promenades; Management agreed to spray these thistles with Round-up.

Communications Committee: In Marg Hough's absence, Management reported that the Communications Committee will meet July 31st to discuss Pathfinder issues. Peter Bakas suggested that an updated photo of the Board of Directors would be a welcome addition to the GTIA website.

Parks Committee: Betty Long stated that Timber Park playground is now open. It was also noted Coach House Park is open. John Charicki will attend the July 19th Lisle Park District Board meeting. Betty Long will

obtain the necessary evaluation forms for the annual inspection by GTIA Board members of Lisle Park District parks within Green Trails.

Nominating Committee: In Rob Getz's absence, Management reported that an article is being prepared for the August newsletter to solicit nominees for the annual Board of Directors election.

Old Business/New Business: Seal coating has been completed; overlay is in process along Green Trails in Woodglen.

Area Reports: None

Executive Session: Board Motion: Rodd Elges motioned to adjourn to Executive session, Betty Long seconded. The motion was passed by unanimous voice vote at 8:15 p.m.

Money examined various factors to rate the communities, and they concluded what Lisle residents already know. This is a great place to live!

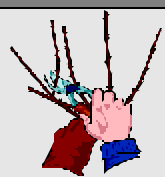
Lisle Library Renovation Project



Lisle Library's interior renovation project will begin on or about September 1st. The library's meeting rooms will be closed for events until early February, so that the room can be used to store some of the contents of the areas under construction.

The library will remain open to serve our patrons as much as is possible during the work, but there may be some short periods where the nature of the work will require closing some or all of the library. The Youth Services Department will be renovated first. It is anticipated that the Youth Services collection will be inaccessible for four to five weeks beginning in September. Before the closure, there will be special extended loan periods on children's materials, so that young readers can stock up on reading materials. Extended loans will be available for materials in the adult collection should these collections become unavailable.

American Veterans Traveling Tribute Wall Coming to Lisle September 6-9, 2007



The Ross Bishop VFW Post 5696, in concert with the Village of Lisle, the Lisle-Woodridge Fire District, the Lisle Police Department, the Lisle Visitors & Convention Bureau, and Rolling Thunder, Illinois Chapter 1, is honored to be hosting the *American Veterans Traveling Tribute*, Sept. 6-9, 2007. The Wall will be set up for viewing on the Old Village Hall site at Main Street and Burlington Avenue.

American Veterans Traveling Tribute (AVTT) travels the USA each year participating in sponsored events with a mission to honor, respect, and remember those who served, and thus those who are serving.

The *Vietnam Memorial Traveling Wall* is an 80% size replica visual presentation; standing over 8' tall at the apex, and over 370 feet long. *The Cost Of Freedom* displays are 9 large memorials represented in gold dog tags under glass to remember and honor all who died in service since Vietnam, including 9/11. A large art display, *Vietnam Remembered*, and *A Walk of Heroes'* display also accompanies AVTT.

AVTT has no political agenda. All who visit each event can share a common bond of experience and patriotic thanks. A person is not gone until the memories are; AVTT is dedicated to remembering all with honor.

America cannot forget those who sacrificed all, and supports all who have served and are serving. This is vital education for our youth.

Educational school field trip opportunities will take place at 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. Friday, September 7, 2007.

The Wall will be open to the public 24 hours a day.

Many worthwhile events are being planned throughout the visit to Lisle: **September 5th at 2 p.m.** there will be a **Ceremonial Escort** of *The Wall* into town. The escort will begin at Heritage Harley Davidson, travel east on Ogden Ave, then South on Main street. **Residents are encouraged to line Main Street with American Flags at that time to welcome this historic event to Lisle.**

In addition to the sponsored school field trips, on Friday, **September 6th**, we will hold a **9/11 Tribute beginning at 5:30 p.m.** The **keynote speaker for this event is Mr. David Beamer, father of Flight 93's Hero, Todd Beamer.**

Saturday, September 7th, the Rolling Thunder, Chapter 1 Motorcycle Club is hosting a "Run To The Wall" followed up by a Remembrance Table Ceremony. More than 200 motorcyclists are expected to participate in this event. To sign your group up, contact Steve Pletzke at 630-292-4440.

Sunday, September 8th will feature a memorable Rifle Ceremony and tribute to our Veterans with Closing Ceremonies beginning at 6 p.m.
